Population of Aging Veterans

- Nearly 42 percent of the almost 23 million American veterans are aged 65 and older.
- More than 1.4 million veterans are aged 85 and older.
- Nearly 33 percent of Veterans Affairs (VA) enrollees are aged 75 and older.

Population of Minority Veterans

- The percentage of minority veterans will increase from 21 percent in 2011 to 34 percent in 2040.
- Minority veterans are younger overall than White veterans, but American Indian/Alaska Native and Asian veterans are the oldest (median age of 57 years).
- The majority of minority veterans are Black (11 percent). Hispanics (6 percent) are the next largest racial/ethnic group, and the Hispanic veteran population will double by 2040.
